- “I was a stranger and you welcomed me.”* – What is Christian hospitality? What are its roots in scripture and early Church practice? Jesus was both guest and host and all lives were touched and changed by his presence. Can we recover this Christian virtue in our schools and parishes?

- Encountering Our Storytelling God* – Using the spiritual insights of St. Francis de Sales, a reflection upon the stories contained in the texts of scripture and the texts of our lives leads us to see the movement of God. This, in turn, directs us to our authentic vocation, which is that point where our great passion and the world's great needs meet.
- Living the Intentional Life: Seeing Our Journey within the Pattern of Jesus' Life* – Drawing upon the gospel pattern of Jesus' life – birth, ministry, passion, resurrection – and the themes of the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius, we can find our place in life's journey. In this way, we can see the pattern of our lives as part of God's great pattern for the world.
- David: A Person of Contradictions* – David was the greatest of all kings, yet the Bible retains two versions of his life story – one tragic (found in 1 and 2 Samuel) and the other triumphant (found in 1 Chronicles). Unpacking the story of this person of contradictions provides us with a means for coming to grips with our own sense of failure and success.
- Finding God in the Tensions of Life* – The Old Testament is for many a jumble of stories and books. Yet its main theological impulses can be simplified to two main strands that are represented by two mountains: Sinai and Zion. These two traditions stand in some tension with each other, which opens the way for the revelation of Christ. The tensions we feel within ourselves often reflect this same biblical pattern – and thus they too can create space for Christ.

The Gr8ful Way: Biblical Methods of Praying – the 2008 Synod on the Word of God stressed that we are called to encounter Christ by actively praying with Scripture. But we are all so busy, how to find the time? Experience eight simple prayer methods using scripture, each one only requiring about eight minutes of time.
